

Traveler Statewide Resources and COVID-19

The [Traveler Statewide Databases](#) are a collection of digital resources from the Arkansas State Library for all Arkansas residents. These exceptional information resources are available and accessible to all public, school, and academic libraries. Arkansas resident can also access the databases from the State Library's webpage with no additional logins required. You just need to be in the state of Arkansas with your device's location services turned on.

Several of the Traveler database vendors have provided additional information and resources that you may find helpful.

World Book Encyclopedias [COVID-19 Toolkit World Book](#)

World Book has created this [training page](#) covering ways you can use their resources to support distance learning. This page includes additional information about each of their products, video tutorials, at home lesson ideas, and resources for parents. World Book has also made all of their products available until at least April 30.

If you are in one of the other World Book databases and click "World Book Products" at the bottom left-hand side of the page, you will find resources that we do not usually have access to like Activity Corner, Dramatic Learning, Science Power, and Social Studies Power. ProQuest

[ProQuest](#) offers journal articles from reputable sources on varying topics. ProQuest Central will search all the ProQuest database offerings at once or you can search each of the 70+ database individually. ProQuest is offering instant unlimited user access granted on [eBook Central](#) from 50+ publishers. Just as a reminder to anyone who originally used Ebrary, ProQuest discontinued Ebrary, but the resources were absorbed by eBook Central.

Mango Languages

Now is a great time to try out [Mango Languages](#) if you are unfamiliar with this language database. They even have specialty units such as "Spanish for Librarians" or units covering medical terms. The Traveler subscription to Mango does not include Mango Classroom which is geared specifically towards schools; however, Mango just [announced](#) that they are making Mango Classroom available to schools for the 2019-2020 school year, so this may be of particular interest to some of the school librarians and educators out there.
